

Piney Baptist Church.



Davis Funeral Home's Veteran of the Week

Rob Dryman is the son of Donna and Mike Maples. Rob grew up in Roane and Morgan Counties. He spent some time with his grandparents, Jim and Rose Schubert in Wartburg. My son Scott got to know him on the many camping trips that Jim and Rose took. When I saw Rob (Robbie, we called him) I thought what a nice kid; Donna his mother has to be really proud of him.

Rob graduated from Roane County High School in 1988 and in 1989 he volunteered for the Air Force. He stayed in the Air Force for twenty years and retired in 2009. He did three tours in Iraq. His job was Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD). In 2006 his mother emailed him asking what his job involved in Iraq.

This is what Rob sent back. Our job here is to support Coalition Forces (CF), Iraqi Police (IP), Iraqi Army (IA), and Local Nationals (LN). We support them in several ways. First, by disarming IEDs set out by the insurgents; we average two a day in our area of operations (AO) which is about sixty square miles in Northern Iraq. Second, we ride in convoys that are searching for IEDs and help spot them. Third, we destroy caches of any and all explosives we find. The stuff is everywhere here.

I can't get into details on how we do the disarming, but we use remote techniques when possible.

While riding in the convoys, we destroy any hazards that pose a threat to supply convoys that will be using that same route. When applicable we try to nail the people responsible for placing the hazards. Today while one of our teams worked on an IED a man stopped his car and set a bag on the road close to the convoy. Then he looked up and saw one small helicopter hovering nearby. He grabbed the bag and sped away. Well, the convoy chased the vehicle, the helicopter fired warning shots over his hood until he stopped. The security detail detained the man while his vehicle searched. The bag contained three cats and the interpreter told us the man was releasing the cats because they were eating all of his chickens.

We work as an emergency service like the Fire Department. We sit in our shop (a hardened aircraft hangar) until a mission comes in. Then we go to the site with a security element and go to work. Every call is different, you never know what you'll find.

We have the best equipment, people and support that money can



buy – trust me on this. After seeing how the people over here live, we are truly lucky.

To me and probably to his mother this job appears to be dangerous, but Rob said while in Iraq he didn't lose any of his men.

I know most of you have seen the Tunnel to Towers Foundation ads on T.V. and you see veterans who have lost both legs and one arm by IEDs in Iraq or Afghanistan. A lot of times their buddies were killed. What a horrific thing to happen to men who could have families back in the states. For the rest of their lives, they will have to make it without legs and maybe arms. A few came back with burns all over their bodies.

Rob and his crew, no doubt, prevented more of these horrendous things by destroying many of these IEDs.

MSgt's wife Kristi also served ten years in the Air Force. She would have stayed for twenty years but when she got her orders for overseas duty, she didn't want to leave her two children. You can't blame her for that. Altogether the Dryman family gave over

thirty years of their lives to serve their country.

Today Rob and Kristi live on their farm in Texas in which they enjoy tremendously. One child is enrolled at Texas A&M and the other will be there soon.

Rob is an example of a young man who wanted to make something of himself and at the same time serve his country.

Rob was discharged from the Air Force in 2009. But every year he is reconnected with a buddy he met in Iraq. He was not in Rob's team but he was in an EOD team that did the same job and he got his legs blown off by an IED. Every year Rob and his buddy go bird hunting in North Dakota. Rob has to carry him a distance to where they can shoot at pheasants. What a great thing to do with a veteran who sacrificed his limbs in Iraq. Military men get close to their buddies. They might be from a state over a thousand miles from their home state but that doesn't matter.

Rob, the veterans here at American Legion Post 149 want to thank you for your service. We also want to thank Kristi for serving her country. It is men and women like you who keep our country free.

Law Enforcement Officer of the Week

Corrections Officer Robert Daniels with the Graves County Jail, KY was killed when a large tornado struck a building he was working in while supervising inmates on work release in Mayfield, KY.

Officer Daniels was supervising seven inmates who were participating in the work release program at the Mayfield Consumer Products Candle Factory at 112 Industrial Drive. A large tornado that had tracked over 200 miles across multiple states struck the city of Mayfield, completely destroying the factory and a large portion of the city.

Officer Daniels and numerous factory employees were killed when the building collapsed. All seven inmates were rescued from the rubble, however, one escaped after being treated at a local hospi-

tal. Regarding the tornados, the death toll from the series of tornados that roared across five

states rose as somber rescuers picked through the rubble of shattered buildings and communities, searching for survivors and remains.

More than 30 tornadoes were reported late Friday and early Saturday, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. Kentucky was hardest hit, with 50 confirmed fatalities early Sunday, but scores more people were missing and feared dead after



a tornado here destroyed a candle factory where more than 100 people were inside.

In Illinois, at least six people were killed when a tornado ripped through an Amazon warehouse

north of St. Louis. Four deaths were confirmed in Tennessee and two each in Arkansas and Missouri.

Kentucky Gov. Andy Beshear said Sunday more than 100 people probably died in his state alone, including at least two of his own relatives. Entire towns were flattened

by the twisters, he said. Emergency responders went door-to-door looking for survivors – although in some cases “there aren't doors,” he said. He said several children were among the dead.

“I know we lost a number of kids,” Beshear said on the CBS show “Face the Nation.” “This tornado did not discriminate. Anybody in its path, even if they were trying to be safe.”

Just like the boat builders, Kelly and Allen seemed to excel in putting together the best sleds. Kelly's dad was a sometime carpenter and I guess Kelly came up with more skill than Glen and I had. Sometimes we had to ride a piece of tin down the hill.

Our hill was at Grandpa Redmon's house; not far from any of our houses. When it came a big snow, you would find all four of us, plus some sisters standing at the top of the hill looking down at the three apple trees trying to figure out how we were going to miss them with our sleds.

On one particular day we had over six inches of snow and a cold north wind was blowing. We always tried to dress as warm as we could, but we knew we would have to go into Grandpa and Grandma's house when our hands and feet got too cold. I remember us going into their house many times but I don't remember Grandma ever complaining about us tracking through her house. Their house was built back in the early part of the 1900's and it had three fireplaces, but most of the time they only used one of them. I don't think the big two-story house had any insulation in it and I'm pretty sure it was built by Raney Potter, Grandma's half-brother. Raney did a pretty good job, but his

materials were limited. Grandpa at one time had a mill located on his property on what would one day become Highway 62 and where Mud Creek bridge was located. He made wooden shingles that were used on roofs for many homes back in those days. Grandpa even made shingles for the first Liberty Church.

Grandpa was always sitting by the fireplace when we went in. Sometimes he would talk to us and at other times he just sat there. Sometimes the wood he cut for his fireplace would pop and send coals out in front and sometime we would

our house we called Dave's Pond. It was shallow and it usually froze solid every winter. Our winters back then were fiercer than what we see today.

Sometimes other kids would join us on the pond and we would drum up some games to play. Our Aunt Meg at age 80+ joined up one time.





The IOC Is a Craven Handmaid of Beijing

It should be a rule of thumb that the Olympic Games shouldn't be held in countries that operate concentration camps.

If this strikes you as a reasonable demand, you aren't suited to serve on the International Olympic Committee. The IOC has doggedly defended Beijing as the host of the 2022 Winter Olympics even as the Chinese Communist Party pursues its campaign of unrelenting barbarity against the Uyghurs.

The Biden administration just announced a so-called diplomatic boycott of the games, a gesture of disapproval that won't dent the propaganda coup the IOC is handing the most dangerous regime in the world.

The IOC is the World Health Organization of sports. When China disappeared female tennis star Peng Shuai for the offense of making an accusation of sexual assault against a former high government official, the IOC happily assisted in the regime's crisis PR, lest the shocking incident derail the games.

The president of the IOC, Thomas Bach, had a video call with Peng where she said all was well and Bach pretended to take her assurances at face value. Of course, Peng wasn't free to speak her mind, but part of Bach's job now is to look the other way at China's blatant abuses.

China has the great fortune to deal with international organizations -- except the Women's Tennis Association, which is suspending tournaments in China -- that lack all self-respect.

The IOC is following in the well-trod footsteps of corporations, financiers and sports leagues that start out wanting to do business with China and end up complicit in the regime's crimes by staying silent or explaining them away.

The difference is that the IOC claims to be acting in support of high ideals. Bach likes to quote the Olympic charter that says Olympism exists "to place sport at the service of the harmonious development of humankind, with a view to promoting a peaceful society concerned with the preservation of human dignity."

Placing sport at the service of China does the opposite on all counts. China's autocrat, Xi Jinping, has been open about the political importance of the Olympics, "Hosting an excellent 2022 Games is a major task of the Party and the country, and it is a solemn commitment to the international community." Here, the interests of the CCP and the IOC -- as well as the corporate sponsors of the games -- coincide.

The last time China hosted the Olympics, the Summer Games in 2008, it used the opening ceremony to stage a gigantic and memorable regime-enhancing spectacle. Beijing promised reforms to get awarded the games and then, true to form, engaged in yet more heavy-handed repression.

If the 2008 Beijing Games were ill-advised, next year's Winter Olympics are a complete travesty. The atrocities in Xinjiang province are a matter of public record and the quashing of Hong Kong proceeds apace. No one who crosses the regime is safe from imprisonment or worse. China openly menaces Taiwan with an invasion. Indeed, China could conceivably be in a shooting war with the United States within a year or two of using the presence of our athletes, among others, to enhance the rule of its dictator-for-life.

Bach insists that the IOC must always be politically neutral. As Michael Mazza of the American Enterprise Institute points out, though, the IOC banned apartheid-era South Africa from the games. There is no such thing as neutrality when dealing with an all-encompassing police state for which politics is a life-or-death matter. The games aren't being hosted by Switzerland or Norway -- nice, law-abiding countries with good ski slopes -- but a revanchist power that tramples on human dignity and is a clear and present danger to international peace.

The IOC could have taken an off-ramp from these games at any point. Instead, its attitude is going to be, "Enjoy the snowboarding, never mind the concentration camps."





Explore Oak Ridge history and future

The Oak Ridge Convention and Visitors Bureau was formed by City Council on June 1, 1981. The purpose of the Bureau was to market and promote Oak Ridge as a travel destination, promote the City's natural resources and sports facilities and unique history. The CVB promotes all events that happen in the City as well as the museums, Manhattan Project National Historical Park and attractions in town.

The activities and promotions of the Visitors Bureau are funded from a portion of hotel occupancy taxes. That means that no tax dollars are used to promote tourism because our hotel guests pay to help promote the city to future guests. The other sources of revenue for the CVB are state tourism grants and proceeds from the Secret City Half Marathon.

In June 2015, the CVB began using the name "Explore Oak Ridge" to market the attractions and outdoor activities within the City and increase hotel occupancy and local spending. The Oak Ridge Breakfast Rotary Club paid to design and trademark the Explore Oak Ridge logo and it has been incorporated into all promotion of Oak Ridge Tourism.

My first interaction with ORCVB was in 2006 when Keith McDaniel involved me as a co-producer for the Secret City documentary films. Joe Valentino was the director at that time as was also being interviewed by Keith for the documentary. Those documentaries are still currently used today to help promote Oak Ridge and can be found here: <https://www.y12.doe.gov/about/history/video-gallery>

Over the years since, I have remained closely associated with the efforts of the organization to promote Heritage Tourism in Oak Ridge. Many opportunities for involvement have been enjoyed ranging from the Secret City Festival to other city-wide events. I have been pleased to be asked to be a step-on guide for tourist buses as well as a tour guide for families and individuals visiting our city. Often, I was able to interact with travel writers and tourism professionals.

These interactions with people in the tourism industry are very important as often they write for national tourist travel publications and websites. It is important to have Oak Ridge featured in these publications and media to spread the word about the great things we have to offer visitors of various ages and interests. Whether it our unique history, our world class rowing venue, or the amazing outdoor activities we offer, Oak Ridge can fill up several days full of fun and activities for most visitors.

The Explore Oak Ridge website and social media presence are also important elements that help promote Oak Ridge. The website was re-designed 18-months ago to make it easier to navigate and provide a location where all events in the City can be located for both visitors and residents. I am glad to have been included in the content development of these key media outlets. Videos and blogs are among the many features of the website, and I have been able to offer content that provides information about our history, hiking, photography and much more.

"The social media presence of Explore Oak Ridge allows for the ability to tell the story of the Manhattan Project and our unique history in a way that encourages the viewer to search for more information and dig deeper into planning a trip to a one-of-a-kind location," said Katy Watt, Explore Oak Ridge President. "The staff of New Frame Creative has been instrumental in enhanc-

ing the online presence of Explore Oak Ridge in a fun and exciting manner."

Most recently, a new series of short films featuring Katie the Calutron Girl, began being created to provide a spokesperson to "Share the Secrets" of the Secret City. The idea of Katie the Calutron Girl as a spokesperson was the brainchild of the staff at New Frame Creative. MOMENTS IN TIME

The History Channel

 * On Dec. 30, 1803, Francis Lewis, signer of the Declaration of Independence, dies in New York City at age 90. Lewis' patriotism came at a high cost: The British army destroyed his Long Island estate and took his wife prisoner in 1776.

* On Jan. 1, 1863, farmer Daniel Freeman submits the first claim under the new Homestead Act for a property in Nebraska. By the 1890s, many homesteaders found that farming 160 acres of such dry land was nearly impossible, and at least half the original claims were abandoned.

* On Dec. 27, 1944, during World War II, President Franklin Roosevelt gives orders to seize properties belonging to the Montgomery Ward company because it refused to comply with a labor collective bargaining agreement. Roosevelt said strikes in wartime cannot be condoned.

* On Dec. 29, 1956, the New York Times leaks news that the United States is preparing a major policy statement on the Middle East. The Eisenhower Doctrine would proclaim that the U.S. would use force in the Middle East to contain Soviet aggression.

* On Dec. 31, 1968, the Soviet Union's TU-144 supersonic airliner makes its first flight, months ahead of the Anglo-French Concorde. In 1965, the French had arrested Sergei Pavlov, head of the Paris office of the Soviet airliner Aeroflot, for illegally obtaining classified information about France's supersonic project.

* On Dec. 28, 1973, Aleksandr Solzhenitsyn's "literary investigation" of the police-state system in the Soviet Union, "The Gulag Archipelago, 1918-1956," is published in Paris. On Feb. 12, 1974, Solzhenitsyn was arrested, stripped of his citizenship and deported.

* On Jan. 2, 1980, in response to the December 1979 Soviet invasion of Afghanistan, President Jimmy Carter asks the Senate to postpone action on the SALT II nuclear weapons treaty. Carter feared that the Soviet invasion could lead to its gaining control over much of the world's oil supplies.

1 Corinthians: Chapter 14

(1 Cor. 14:1-19) The relative value of certain gifts: The way of “love” was to be pursued---generally in life and particularly in the matter of spiritual gifts. Spiritual gifts were to be desired, not for personal glory, but because they enhanced one’s ability to serve Christ. Apparently some excessively gloried in the use of tongues (miraculously speaking a foreign language). The fact was, however, prophecy (foretelling or forthtelling) was more utilitarian. Why was that the case? Because if a man had the gift of a certain language, yet was in an audience of a different one, he could not employ his gift unless someone present had the gift of interpretation (translation 12:10). The prophet, on the other hand, spoke to those of his own vernacular. In the former case, the words would be a “mystery” to the audience with no translator; only God would understand. But he who prophesied could edify, exhort, and console (v. 2-3).

Thus, he who speaks in foreign language to an audience without a translator edifies himself alone. On the other hand, the one who prophesies in a language understood by the church edifies them all (v. 4). Ideally, Paul suggests, “I would like for all of you to have the gift of languages; but since that is not the case, it would be more productive if one could simply prophesy and thus able to be understood. The one who prophesies has the advantage over the person with the language gift---unless, of course, the one with the language gift also has the gift of translation, in which case the church would be edified” (v. 4-5).

“What good would be accomplished if I, Paul, came to you speaking in foreign languages (which you could not understand); indeed, what profit would there be in that, unless my speaking revealed to you knowledge, prophecy, or teaching of some kind?” (v. 6). The apostle then employs illustrations to make his point. “If a musical instrument simply makes a sound, with no real conveyance of melody, where is the appreciation?” (v. 7). If trumpeter in battle just blasts a sound (with no distinction between ‘charge’ and ‘retreat’), who would know what to do (v.8)? Even so, those of you who insist on using your foreign-language gift (with no translator) are doing nothing but speaking to the air” (v. 9).

“There are many languages in the world, and each has its significance. But if mere unintelligible sounds are made, he who so speaks might as well be a foreigner (v.11). Since you are zealous for spiritual gifts, why not seek something by which you can effectively communicate (v.12)? If, therefore, one has the gift of a foreign language, let him not attempt to use it recklessly; rather, let him ask God for the accompanying gift of translation (v. 13). One might be able to lead a prayer by means of his language gift, but if there is no translator for his alien audience, his words will not be fruitful” (v. 14). Consequently: “If I lead a prayer or a song, I will not do so except that my words are ‘fruitful’ to the audience (v. 15). If your direction is not meaningful to the group, how could they possibly say, ‘Amen’?” (v. 16). Our worship must not only be directed to God, others must be edified as well (v. 17). (The term “sing” (v. 15) does not suggest instrumental accompaniment, as some allege. In New Testament times, it signified unaccompanied singing.)

Paul says, “I am thankful to God that he has honored me with the gift of being able to speak in various languages to diversified audiences. I have been blessed in that regard more than all of you. But I will not abuse my gift, as many of you are doing. I had rather speak a mere five words, conveying my understanding to others, instructing them, than to utter ten thousand words that no one can comprehend” (v. 18-19).

(1 Cor. 14:20-25) An admonition regarding gifts: A sharp rebuke follows” “Brothers, stop acting like children, ambitious to show off your gift. This exhibits a malice (unkind disposition) that should not be in mature people” (v. 20). To make a point, Paul cites from the book of Isaiah (28:11), where Jehovah attempted to teach southern Judah by the example of the Assyrians (“men of strange languages”), who invaded and conquered northern Israel. But Judah refused to profit from that lesson. It was an incomprehensible message to a stiff-necked people. In just such a manner, even if the whole church assembled and all spoke with foreign languages (each in turn), and outsiders entered the assembly, hearing only confusing sounds (with no sensible translation), would they not say, “You people are insane!” (v. 21-23)? The doctrine of attempting to teach with words (or sounds) that no one can possibly understand is crazy! (This condemns Pentecostalism’s “ecstatic utterances.”) Miraculous languages were a “sign” to convince unbelievers of the authenticity of the gospel (Acts 2:1-13). They were not for putting on a show in church (v. 22).

On the other hand, if the gifted were merely prophesying (which required no translator), and the unbeliever enters the assembly, he might well be convinced of the truth of the message, and gospel truth would compel him to pronounce judgment upon his sinful condition. His evil life thus is acknowledged, and he yields to God, seeking pardon via the plan of salvation (v. 24-25).

Savor Holiday Morning With Bake-Ahead Quiche

Before the morning erupts into chaos while the kiddies (and kids at heart) unwrap everything under the tree, give a gift that everyone is guaranteed to love. Start your holiday celebration with a delicious quiche Lorraine.

Named after the Lorraine region of France, classic quiche Lorraine (keesh loh-rain) is the queen of quiches. A buttery, flaky crust is filled with a rich, savory egg custard, crisp bacon and Swiss cheese, and baked in a pie or tart pan. What's not to love?

Quiche is one of those dishes that everyone should know how to make. They're perfect for holidays because they can be prepared in advance and refrigerated or frozen, then quickly reheated. Quiche is wonderful served hot, warm or cold, for breakfast, lunch or a light dinner. It's quite elegant but surprisingly quick and easy to throw together.

Another reason to love quiche this time of year is because most of the ingredients go on sale for the holidays. Historically, prices are great on eggs, bacon, heavy cream and pre-made pie crusts. Of course, it's even less expensive to make the crust from scratch, but if you've got enough on your to-do list, buy a frozen one.

Quiche recipes are extremely adaptable. To be completely accurate, in France, there are three kinds of quich-

es. Quiche Lorraine, made with bacon or lardons only (modern preparations of the dish usually include Swiss cheese); Vosgienne, with bacon and cheese; and Alsacienne, with bacon, onions and cheese. The French are exceptionally protective of these distinctions. Of course, you can use whatever ingredients you have on hand. Quiches are also a great way to use up leftovers.

Favorite side dishes for quiche include a bowl of mixed fruit for breakfast or brunch. For lunch or dinner, add a green salad or tomato soup and a nice glass of white wine.

CLASSIC QUICHE LORRAINE

- 8 slices bacon (cooked crisp and crumbled)
- 1 cup whole milk
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 4 eggs (beaten)
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- Dash black pepper
- Pinch ground nutmeg

- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 2 cups Swiss cheese, shredded
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1 (9-inch) unbaked pastry shell

1. Preheat oven to 375 F.
2. In a mixing bowl, combine the milk, cream, eggs, salt, pepper, nutmeg and thyme, and beat well with a whisk or eggbeater. In another bowl, toss the cheese with the flour. Sprinkle cheese and crumbled bacon into the unbaked pastry shell.

3. Now, carefully pour the egg mixture into the pie shell.

4. Bake the quiche for 40 to 50 minutes, until egg mixture is mostly set and slightly puffed, and the top is golden. Let rest for 10 minutes, then slice into wedges to serve.

To Make Ahead: Bake the quiche and let it cool completely, then cover with plastic wrap and store in the refrigerator for up to three days, or freezer up to three months. Reheat loosely covered with foil in a 325 F oven for 15 to 20 minutes, or until warmed through.

TIP: Don't use half and half as a substitute for the

heavy cream and milk. Heavy cream is 38% fat and milk is 4%, so that the result is 21% fat. Half and half is only 12% fat, and while still delicious, gives a different end result.

Year-end strategy defer revenue and accelerate expense

If you have made a profit projection for the year and your taxes will be more than you had anticipated, this is a strategy that you may want to consider to reduce your taxes.

If you are using the cash basis for your tax return, revenue is determined by the date you receive it. For businesses using the accrual basis, revenue is determined based on when it is earned. The vast majority of small businesses are on the cash basis can have the ability to defer revenue. The accounting basis of your business is reported on your tax return. However, contact a tax professional if you aren't sure where to find it on the return.

If your business is currently using the accrual basis, you can change to the cash basis by filing Form 3115 to change the accounting method with the IRS. However, it would be a good idea to consult with an expert tax professional before making the change.

You will need to quit billing customers and patients near the end of the year. Customers and patients won't pay you if you haven't sent a bill. By postponing the December bills and sending them in early January, you can reduce your taxes by reducing your income.

Use the IRS Safe Harbor to pay your expenses in advance. IRS Regulation 1.263(a)-4(f) contains a safe harbor rule that enables cash-basis taxpayers to pay and deduct qualifying expenditures up to 12 months in advance without challenge by the IRS. Qualifying expenses include lease payments on vehicles, rent payments on offices, and business insurance. Prepaying

office rent and lease payments for up to a year can enable you to significantly increase your deductions. Consequently, taking advantage of this rule can have a huge impact on your tax liability.

If the advance rent paid payment will cause a problem for your landlord, the advance rent can be mailed on December 30. By mailing the advance rent payment on December 30, you can deduct it in the current year. This will keep your landlord happy since he will receive the rent in the year he expected it. He won't have to report the rental income a year early since he won't have received it until January. Use certified mail for the payment in case you need to provide proof of the date you mailed it to the IRS.

Before using this strategy, you should determine whether prepaying expenses makes sense. This will depend on your tax rate this year and your rate in future years. Keep in mind future changes in tax laws that might raise your taxes. If your income increases substantially next year, you could be better off not prepaying expenses and instead maximizing your deductions for next year.

Midway Takes Two from Wartburg in Last-Second Thrillers

Small town and country living is about as exciting as watching grass grow! While that might be the opinion of some folks, no basketball fan who watched two intense battles unfold in the Midway High School gymnasium Tuesday evening could possibly agree. It hasn't been a stellar year for area basketball teams, and as Wartburg made the trek South of the River to take on Midway, one could only wonder about the level of play that would soon take place. Each of the four teams would take the floor with a losing record.

No one could have accurately predicted what was about to happen. Who could predict that all four teams would play as if this was their last opportunity on earth? Who could predict that fans would be treated not to games but to open warfare with all the strategy and intensity that could be brought to bear? Yes, it was warfare – bodies were strewn here and there, and blood literally flowed. Each game concluded in the same way – Midway hit free throws in the last seconds to earn hard-fought victories by only one-point margins. But fans of both schools were the real winners by being treated to some of the best basketball witnessed in this area in the past several years.

Midway Uses Strong Defense to Defeat Lady Bulldogs 43-42

“Never underestimate a Mike Hayes team.” Even I did not fully understand the implication of these words that I spoke to Wartburg Assistant Girls Coach Michael Poland as I entered the Midway gym. I had a good basis for my comment – both of my daughters played basketball at Oakdale 30+ years ago and Hayes' Midway teams were always some of their most formidable opponents. Two hours after I spoke with Poland, a dejected Wartburg Lady Bulldog team left the court as Hayes' Lady Wave celebrated their 43-42 victory.

Midway came into the game with a 2-3 record, averaging less than 39 points per game. Good on defense, the Lady Wave have been challenged when it comes to offensive performance. The Wartburg Lady Bulldogs were 2-4 on the season with a scoring average of 43 points per game, but once scored 60 points in a victory over Loudon. Notably, Wartburg has relied heavily on 3-point shooting for their scoring and can sometimes make it appear as if it is raining threes.

Put all these factors into Hayes' basketball brain and out comes a strategy that proved to be highly effective for the Lady Wave - use a full-court, pressure defense to force Wartburg turnovers and to take away 3-point shooting opportunities.

Hayes' strategy worked to near perfection in the first quarter of play as the press forced several Wartburg turnovers and the Lady Bulldogs made only one 2-point basket. The Lady Wave led 10-2 after eight minutes of play with Abbie Parks scoring five points in the quarter.

Midway quickly advanced their lead to 12-2 as the second quarter began. With 6:58 on the clock, Wartburg's Olivia Davis drove through the Midway defense for a layup that sparked the Wartburg offense. In just over one minute, the Lady Bulldogs put seven more points on the board to trim Midway's lead to 12-11 at 5:41. Defense continued to dominate play and Midway led 18-16 at the half. Sara Beth Nickell and Stella Tilley each hit 3-point baskets for the Lady Wave. Elizabeth Keathley scored five points for Wartburg, and Olivia Davis added four points.

Midway expanded their lead to 23-16 at 5:19 of the third quarter. With almost four minutes elapsed in the quarter, Wartburg finally got on the board with a free throw with 4:12 on the clock. With another scoring spurt, the Lady Bulldogs closed the gap to 23-22 at 3:33. Midway pulled ahead 29-23 with 25 seconds remaining in the third quarter. Wartburg's Olivia Davis then electrified the crowd with a 3-point shot from near half court as the buzzer sounded to trim Midway's lead to 29-26. Davis led Wartburg with seven points in the quarter.

Wartburg's Davis closed the gap to 29-28 with a 2-point shot near the circle early in the fourth quarter. Wartburg then took the lead 30-29 on a shot under the basket by Selena Byrge at 7:01. The teams swapped the lead twice before Wartburg went ahead 34-31 on a drive to the basket by Cynthia Daugherty. Midway tied the game 36-36 with 2:44 on the clock, and again at 39-39 with 1:36 remaining as the teams battled back and forth. Midway once again took the lead 41-39 with 35 seconds on the clock, but Wartburg regained the lead 42-41 when Elizabeth Keathley sank two free throws with only three seconds left on the clock.

These three seconds turned into minutes as the coaches called multiple time outs to plot strategy. Finally, Midway put the ball into play under Wartburg's basket with only three seconds in which to move the length of the court and score. It was a play that will long be remembered in Midway basketball lore. Midway threw the ball in half the length of the court to a breaking Stella Tilley who drew a foul with 1.8 seconds to go. Tilley coolly stepped up to the line and buried two free throws to give the Lady Wave a hard-fought 43-42 victory over Wartburg. Tilley led Midway in the quarter with nine points, while Sierra Cowell added four points. Keathley led Wartburg scorers, shooting 5 of 6 at the free throw line.

Tilley led Midway's balanced scoring for the game with 14 points. Parks and Cowell added nine points each, and Sara Beth Nickell contributed eight points. Marissa Stakely scored two points for the Lady Wave.

Wartburg's Davis led all scorers with 15 points, Keathley followed with 10 points, Byrge scored seven points, Edye-Ann Williams added four points, and Madison Shadden and Daugherty each scored 3 points.

As for Hayes' strategy, Wartburg connected on only two 3-point shots the entire game.

Midway Survives Wartburg Comeback for 94-93 Barnburner Victory

In a torrid, hard-fought battle that gave fans hardly any opportunity to breathe along the way, the Midway Greenwave toppled the Wartburg Bulldogs 94-93 when Emmett Hegland sank two free throws with only 3.9 seconds left on the clock. The number of points scored by both teams belies the fact that each applied defensive pressure throughout the game – very few shots were uncontested.

The uniqueness of the game is exemplified by the superlative 38-point performance of Wartburg's Tanner Johnson being eclipsed by the school record 50-point performance of Midway's Ethan Parks. The game was not what one would expect from two teams with losing records, but instead was a game that will long be remembered by the fans who witnessed the almost unbelievable performance by both teams.

Wartburg took an early 8-5 lead after three minutes of play. Midway went on a 12-0 scoring run for the next four minutes, taking a 17-8 lead with 1:07 on the clock. Wartburg then outscored the Greenwave 8-2 in the final minute to close out the first quarter with Midway leading 19-16. Ethan Parks scored 10 points for Midway, with Emmett Hegland adding five points in the quarter. Blaine Blalock had the hot hand for Wartburg, sinking two 3-point shots.

Midway went on a scoring rampage in the second quarter, outscoring Wartburg 27-19 and taking a 46-35 halftime lead. Ethan Parks continued his hot hand and added 17 points to his total. Emmett Hegland and Dalton Cowell added four points each. Andrew Goode kept Wartburg in the game with eight points.

Midway began the third quarter with a 7-0 scoring run, extending their lead to 53-35 with 6:36 on the clock. Enter one Tanner Johnson, who had remained largely dormant for the Bulldogs up to this point with only four points. Johnson took leadership of the Bull-

dog offense and scored 17 points in the remainder of the third quarter. Meanwhile, Parks poured in 15 more points for the Greenwave. The pace of the game accelerated to the point of being breathtaking just to watch as the teams scored a combined 51 points in the quarter and Wartburg trimmed Midway's lead to 71-61.

Midway extended their lead to 76-63 with 7:11 on the clock in the final quarter. Meticulously, the Bulldogs chipped away at the Greenwave lead, pulling within six points at 5:28. The dizzying pace of the game continued. The Bulldogs pulled within one point, 89-88, with 2:07 on the clock and then took the lead 91-90 at 1:05. Tension mounted within the gymnasium. Brennan Reed scored a layup on a fast break to put the Greenwave ahead 92-91 with 47 seconds remaining.

Not to be outdone, the Bulldogs regained the lead 93-92 at 31.9 on the clock. Midway had an opportunity to go ahead at 4.8 on the clock but missed the front end of a one plus one free throw. Emmett Hegland snagged the rebound and was fouled as he attempted a shot underneath. Hegland stepped to the free throw line and sank both shots to put the Greenwave ahead 94-93 with 3.9 seconds to go. Wartburg was unsuccessful in getting the ball into play and the Greenwave closed out with a 94-93 victory.

Wartburg and Midway combined for a remarkable 55 points in the final quarter. Tanner Johnson Led the way with 17 points. Ethan Parks led Midway with eight points and Brennan Reed added seven points.

For the game, Parks scored an astounding 50 points, which included only one 3-point basket, and which set a new Midway school record for single-game scoring. Hegland added 18 points for the Greenwave and Reed scored 15 points.

Johnson was Wartburg's high scorer for the game with 38 points. Elijah Heinze added 13 points, followed closely by Goode and Blalock with 11 points each.
