





Dear Dr Holmes, I am so glad that you are joining us

here at Morgan County Today to help us all with oral health! Mimi says

that taking care of our teeth is very important. No matter what age, young or old, oral care should be a priority. So, what should parents do with all that candy that the kids will be getting during this most sugary time of the year? Also, when kids (even

adults) indulge, how do they minimize the affects of all that yummy stuff on their teeth?

Hello Ms Avery Pearl! Here are my ideas on what to do with all that candy and how to keep healthy teeth, for kids and the

kids at heart, during this Halloween season. You are correct, this is the sugariest time of the year.

- 1. Enjoy the Holiday! Halloween is once a year and it is a time for enjoying candy and treats, and that's okay. Be sure that brushing the teeth is last thing before bedtime. Making sure not to sneak snacks after the last brushing. Don't let little ones (or adults) go to sleep with sugar or other treats still in their mouth. Also, Drink plenty of water Plan to take some water bottles during your trick-or-treat adventure. Staying hydrated (and rinsing candy from your mouth) is the best way to counteract the rush of sugar in the mouth.
- 2. Candy is not a snack. Moderation is key. Avoid letting your child snack on candy between meals. The more sugar our children eat, the higher their risk of cavities (as well as other general health concerns). Candy is completely empty calories--they will provide a short term burst of energy. However, when this "sugar rush" is gone, usually a craving for more sugar or candy will return. So instead, try

giving candy more as a treat or dessert at the end of a normal meal.

- 3. Consider Trading Candy. Kids love candy, but they also love toys, money, or even a new pair of shoes. Consider a family trade-in program where kids can use their candy to "purchase" something else.
- 4. Give Candy Away There are some great programs out there that will accept your unwanted (or

excess) candy, like Soldiers' Angels- Treats for Troops.

5. Sticky Candies Are A Nightmare For Teeth! They are the worst for causing cavities. They have a high concentration of sugar, AND they stick in the grooves and surfaces of teeth for a long time. Chocolate will melt away from the teeth much faster in the warm environ-

ment of the mouth. Parents should help children sort their bag of loot and eliminate all the gummy, sticky, gooey, and sour candies. When we splurge on candy, we need to be sure to brush or rinse with water very soon after.

I hope that all the kids enjoy this Halloween season and that all the spooky costumes don't scare you too much, Ms Avery Pearl.







MICHAEL, "BRIGHT STAR" PERFORMERS DAZZLE AND DANCE TO THE THRILL OF HUGE "MUSIC ON MAIN" CROWD

While the UT football team was struggling to beat Texas A&M in Knoxville, a crowd of over 250 people looking for a rousing alternative gathered at Oneida's Main Street in the crisp fall air on Saturday, October 14 to peruse and partake of the various food and craft vendors' wares, listen to some excellent live music, and watch the dual highlights of the afternoon's "Music on Main" event. First, the crowd was riveted to a performance of Michael Jackson's "Thriller," played to perfection by Knoxville's Greg Karney and the K-Town Zombies; then, Scott County's Plateau Players gave spectators a taste of their upcoming live theatre production of Steve Martin/Edie Brickell's play, "Bright Star," and left the crowd excited and wanting more.

An obviously mesmerized onlooker told the Morgan County Today, "Wow! What a show. First Michael Jackson, and then a scene from a play that looked like something you might

see in New York or Atlanta. They all were awesome!"

Knoxville's Michael Jackson, aka Greg Karney told the Morgan County Today," We've been doing this since 2009, when Michael died. There are about 30 dancers who play the zombies, and we bring about 10 of them to a venue when we perform. Each year, we audition new zombie dancers, mostly from Knoxville's Broadway Academy of the Arts. I have enjoyed playing Michael Jackson for quite a while now." Karney not only enjoys what he does, he's very good at it. On this particular October Saturday, folks from all over the region were kind of wandering around the stretch of vendors on Oneida's Main Street, but within less than 30 seconds after Karney and his crew launched into "Thriller," everyone in attendance knew there was something special going

on in front of local business The Black Cat, and a huge crowd pressed in to see and hear what looked like the real thing, Michael Jackson and some well choreographed zombies playing out "Thriller". "It's still the number one music video of all time, and we loved coming to Oneida tonight to do it. This is a great

area with great people," Karney said.

Then, the topping of the evening's exciting live performances came with the Plateau Players' awesome rendition of the scene and song, "Whoa, Momma," acted and sung by "Bright Star's" two leading characters, Jimmy Ray (Seth McMillan) and Alice Murphy (Samantha Connolly), accompanied by the show's dance ensemble. The "Music on Main" crowd was obviously drawn in to the actors' fine delivery of the dialogue and the following song, carried by the exceptional musical talent of both players, backed up by some well timed dancing to boot.

"Bright Star" director Glenda Gray told the Morgan County Today, "This is such a

beautiful story, and it has the overriding theme of hope throughout the play. I want to invite everyone to come to the production. You'll be uplifted and wonderfully entertained by some very talented local people."

The Plateau Players' production of "Bright Star" will be staged November 10, 11 and 12, at the Scott County Christian Care Center's Black Box Theatre. 

John Burns

In November 1993, about 12 days from my 26th birthday, I was notified that I would be traveling to Ft. Benning for the Bravo Company Awards ceremony for feats of heroism. I would be flying home to Columbus and a rendezvous with my Ranger family.

I was taken by ambulance to a waiting military Opinion Columnist transport airplane bound for Columbus, Ga.

A van greeted myself and a couple other BCO

wounded, able to travel back to B company.

As the van entered our Ranger compound outside building 4832, the entire company was standing in formation. As we exited the van, our brothers broke ranks to greet us, and welcome us home. Many of us had not seen each other since the morning of October 3.

After greeting first platoon, and my ranger brother Sean T. Watson, I moved on to 3d platoon. I had not seen the members of my squad, since my medical evacuation from Mogadishu. We had much to discuss. It was amazing to be back in the platoon area. Minus two amazing Ranger leaders. Dominic Pilla was my primary machine gunner assigned to SSG Jeff Strueckers' HMMV in Mogadishu.

Lorenzo Ruiz was my number two on my HMMV. We had a terrible day. From my position on the ground assault convoy, the events of October 3, unfurled before my eyes like a flag. I saw many men shot, blown up, maimed, and heroic all at the same time. The day was won by Ranger's doing what Rangers do.

The ranger leadership model worked. When a SSG or Sgt were wounded, the Specialist's and Private first classes moved up the leadership ladder of responsibility. I was most proud of the members of my platoon. 5 of the 6 Ranger KIA's occurred on the ground assault convoy.

On my HMMV, Specialist Ritchie was wounded early by small arms fire. My primary Gunner, Clay Othic was wounded in the turret engaging the enemy with his 50-caliber machine gun. Clay would find another ride on the five-ton truck being driven by Richard Kowalewski.

Lorenzo would take over for Clay. No hesitation from this warrior from El Paso, Texas. SGT Ruiz was fearless in life. He saved many lives with precision fire from the turret. A bullet fired from the roof of a two -story building would fell Lorenzo. SGT Weaver killed the Somali gunman.

I was wounded slightly by a single piece of hot shrapnel after communicating with SSG Dave Wilson as he was blown up. I was shot in my left scapula when Lorenzo was hit. My third injury and worst gun shot wound, would come as I looked down on Kasey Joyces' face as we engaged an enemy ambush.

My Medic John Stansfield was most heroic after being knocked semi-conscious by a bullet to his helmet.

As he awoke almost immediately, he went back to work treating at first Clay, and later Lorenzo. John was a borrowed medic from Alpha company. God saved John for a purpose. I later learned that he was a believer in Jesus Christ. I knew immediately, why I am alive.

I witnessed Corporal Jim Cavaco get hit in the turret in the vehicle to my immediate front. Killed instantly by a Somali bullet. The worst was still yet to come.

I would run past the stretcher carrying Kasey as the Task Force green medic pronounced him dead. He would be loaded onto the cargo HMMV for transport back to our base. The truck would end up disabled and abandoned as we were rescued by My PL Larry Moores and his relief convoy.

On that HMMV were two other wounded Rangers and the body

of SGT Joyce. The wounded Seal Howard Wasdin. Two other Seals and members of Matt Eversmann's squad trying to re-organize at crash site one. Thank God he had Specialist Dave Diemer and Pfc Jason Moore's.

These two young Rangers kept us in the fight. They engaged enemy targets constantly as we meandered our way home on flat tires and an engine about to explode. These young rangers were heroes!

I would be cross loaded onto a five-ton truck now being driven by a more experienced operator from task Force Green. On that truck were the Somali prisoners from the original target building. Many had been injured or killed by bullets aimed at our Rangers on board.

I was seated across from MSG Tim Griz Martin. He had been blown up while seated behind Adalberto Rodriguez on two MK 19 ammunition cans. An enemy Rocket Propelled Grenade had breached the thin-skinned vehicle and detonated the ammunition sympathetically.

Both men were launched airborne with severe injuries. MSG Martin had lost his legs. He was still trying to organize Rangers to defend the truck. He was seated next to the mangled Specialist Rodriguez.

The worst situation was PFC Kowalewski. He had a live Rocket propelled grenade lodged in his torso, and his arm was severed. He was dead. The RPG was fired from so close, it never armed. Now we were riding home under fire with this added drama.

I had witnessed Super 61 assume an orbit above my initial blocking position. I watched as the helicopter frantically tried to rotate its fuselage to give the gunners a chance to engage the RPG gunner who would knock it out of the sky. Dan Busch was on that bird.

I spoke with my Platoon Sergeant moments after he himself was shot in his hand. Bob was still cool under pressure as he sent me back to my vehicle with the instruction of disseminating to all what the current plan was. We had just driven past crash site one for the first of three times.

This is what we discuss as a platoon but not this night. Tonight, we would party and go visit our favorite place to view girls hardly dressed. Tonight, we would honor our dead and wounded brothers by throwing down third platoon, Bravo company style.

I was glad to be home. I was changed. I just did not realize to what extent the change affected my judgement as an Airborne Ranger combat veteran.

He was crucified upon a cross of wood, yet he created the hill upon which it stood.


He is alive forevermore and he is returning for his virgin bride veery soon. John Burns 11-23-2022

Staff Sergeant John Burns enlisted into the United States Army on September 23, 1987 as an 11C Infantry Mortarman. He graduated from the 7th Infantry Division, Ranger Class 11/89 and served in the invasion of Panama, Desert Storm and the Battle of Mogadishu while assigned to the 75th Rangers.

Some of his many decorations, awards and badges include; Bronze Star Medal for Valor, Purple Heart, Meritorious Service Medal, Sniper Badge, Pathfinder Badge, Master Parachutist Badge, Combat Infantry Badge and Expert Infantry Badge. Throughout his prestigious military career, he traveled to forty-five countries on five continents and all but two states while serving in the military.

He currently serves as the Chaplain for the Special Operations Warrior Foundation. His devout faith demonstrates to all he comes into contact with that he believes nothing but the blood of Jesus Christ can cleanse us from all unrighteousness. He enjoys writing and teaching God's Word while sharing his faith with a dying world.

It was a beautiful but warm day as the excitement for baseball feeled the air everywhere. With nervous anticipation from the parents, grandparents and fans, Jonah took the mound as the starting pitcher for his team. But Jonah's debut as pitcher got off to a rocky start. He got himself into a big time mess walking the first 3 batters (hitting 1 in the helmet), which loaded the bases. When Jonah hit the batter the look on his face was not only of shock, but one of him about to be sick. But the fan's and his teammates rallied behind Jonah with encouragement knowing Jonah could do his job. What happened next was total excitement for everybody to see. 

Revelation Chapter 5

(Rev. 5:1-5) The sealed book: John continued to observe the heavenly vision. He noticed that in the right hand of the Almighty there was a scroll, written on both sides (suggesting the completeness of the message). It may have been composed of several pages, for it was sealed with seven seals. A strong angel with a loud voice asked: "Who is worthy (who had the spiritual qualifications) to open the book, and to loose the seals thereof?" No creature anywhere was suited for such a notable task. Obviously because the message dealt with events to come, only a divine being would be capable of directing future earthly activity. What a commentary this is regarding Christ!

When John contemplated the possibility that the scroll might remain sealed, he audibly wept much (so the original word indicates). One of the twenty-four elders interrupted him: "Stop crying." He then explained, "Behold, the Lion that is of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, hath overcome to open the scroll and the seven seals thereof" (v.5). Note the following: (a) The regal authority of Christ is suggested by the descriptive "Lion" (Gen. 49:9). (b) He was from the tribe of Judah. The Old Testament had foretold the coming of the Messiah out of the tribe of Judah (Gen. 49:10; Heb. 7:14)> (c) Jesus is the "Root of David." This is generally viewed as a reference to the fact that Christ was descended from the Davidic line. Normally, however, a "root" is the source from which the plant springs (1 Tim. 6:10). Moreover, in 22:16 Christ is both the "root" and the "offspring" of David. "Root" thus seems to be something different from "offspring." It appears to stress Jesus' deity in contrast to his humanity. (d) Christ is said to have "overcome." The tense indicates that the event has already been achieved. The victory was won at Calvary---the rest is a mopping-up cam-

(Rev. 5:6) The victorious Lamb: John saw (in the midst of the throne, the living creatures, and the elders) a Lamb, standing as though it has been slain. The "lamb" as a symbol of Christ is common in this book. It appeared to have been slain, but it was "standing" (the perfect tense form suggests that it stood up and remained standing!). The Lamb had seven horns. Since "horn" frequently symbolizes power (Dt. 33:17), and as "seven" denotes perfection, there is the suggestion here that the Lamb is perfect in power.

It has been observed that no one but an inspired composer would have used the lamb motif as a symbol for Christianity. Men employ ravenous beasts to represent their movements. The United States used the eagle; Russia, the bear; Great Britain, the lion; France, the tiger. Only the kingdom of heaven would dare use the lamb as a symbol of its might. The Lamb had "seven eyes," which represented an affinity with the "seven Spirits of God" (the Holy Spirit) (1:4), sent forth (perfect tense---hinting of the abiding nature of the mission) into all the earth.

(Rev. 5:7-14) The Lamb worthy of worship: The Lamb took the scroll from the right hand of the Creator. Note the cooperation between these divine persons. The act evoked a magnificent response from the living creatures and the elders. They fell down before the Lamb---a strong affirmation of the deity of Christ. Each of these heavenly creatures, prostrate before the Lamb, has both a harp and a golden bowl full of incense, symbols of praise and "the prayers of the saints" (Psa. 141:2; Lk. 1:10). It is crass literalism to suggest that these figures afford justification for the use of mechanical instruments of music or the burning of incense in Christian worship. (see video: "The Acappella Church by Mike Mazzalongo").

These heavenly creatures were singing a "new" song which declared the worthiness of the Lamb to open the scroll (with the obvious intent of revealing its message). Christ is qualified to assume this function because of his death (v.9). The death of Jesus and the victory achieved thereby are dominant themes in this document (1:5; 5:12; 7:14; 12:11, etc.).

As a consequence of the blood which he shed, the Lamb was able to "purchase" a people for his own possession. Elsewhere this group is identified as the church of the Lord Jesus (Acts 20:28; 1 Cor. 6:19, 20). Notice also that these purchased ones are a "kingdom"---a clear argument that the church and the kingdom constitute the same organism. Moreover, the international nature of the church is emphasized. These citizens of the kingdom are from every nation, and they are serving as priest in the house of God (1:6; 20:6). No specialized priesthood is needed when all of the Lord's people are priests.

John then records: "And they reign upon the earth" (5:10). Observe that the "purchased" ones are reigning upon the earth---not the elders, etc., as suggested in the King James Version. There is a manuscript variation between "reign" (present tense ASV) and "shall reign" future tense kjv). Which is correct? The context favors the present tense, because the "reigning" is that of this kingdom of priests---a circumstance which was present, not future. There is no reference here to a supposed future millennial reign.

Most of the religious world likes John 3:3, but they do not know how John 3:5 is applied. Using only John 3:3, they will manipulate you to submit to the doctrines of varies men. John 3:5 Jesus says: "Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of water and of the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God." Jesus is not talking about an embryo entering the kingdom of God. But, except man, old enough to comprehend several things which the Holy Spirit delivered through words recorded in the new covenant, (Matthew through Revelation) and believes them enough to submit to King Jesus in immersion (in water symbolizing the burial of one) who is dead in trespasses and sins he cannot enter God's Kingdom (Rom. 6:3-5).


John then heard a voice, a chorus consisting of thousands upon thousands of beings---angels, the twenty-four elders, and the living creatures. Each was praising the Lamb because of his sacrificial death. As a result of that event, Christ is worthy to receive worship due to his power, riches, wisdom, might, honor, glory, and blessedness. The seven traits here catalogued perhaps suggest the complete adoration that is due the victorious Son of God. In other places in this document, these same qualities are ascribed to the Father (5:13; 7:12)---again, evidence of the divine nature of our Lord.

The final expression of praise of the five recorded in chapters four and five is the proclamation of "every created thing" that exists---in heaven, on earth and sea, under the earth (the Hadean realm)---to the glory of both Father and Son. The entire creation acknowledges this truth. Nature's praise of deity is a form of figurative language known as personification (Psa. 148:7-10; Rom. 8:22). Not every person worships the Father and Son, of course, but the divine Godhead is worthy of such. Finally, to nature's anthem the four living ones and the elders add their agreement.

Free income tax filing in Tennessee

The IRS announced that it will conduct a pilot free filing program during the 2024 tax season for thirteen states which includes Tennessee. Eligible taxpayers may choose to participate in the pilot next year to file their tax year 2023 federal tax return for free, directly with the IRS.

Direct File will be a mobile-friendly, interview-based service that will work as well on a mobile phone as it does on a laptop, tablet or desktop computer. The service will be available in English and Spanish for the pilot.

"This is a critical step forward for this innovative effort that will test the feasibility of providing taxpayers a new option to file their returns for free directly with the IRS," said IRS Commissioner Danny Werfel. "In this limited pilot for 2024, we'll be working closely with the states that have agreed to participate in an important test run of the state integration. This will help us gather important information about the future direction of the Direct File program."

The Direct File pilot will be a limited, phased pilot. It will not be available to all eligible taxpayers when the IRS begins accepting tax returns. Because the IRS wants to make sure the program works effectively, Direct File will first be introduced to a small group of eligible taxpayers in filing season 2024. As the filing season progresses, more and more eligible taxpayers will be able to access the service to file their 2023 tax returns. You will continue to have choices including tax software and a tax professional.

If you participate in the pilot, you will have access to help from IRS employees staffing the Direct File customer support function. Direct File will cover only individual federal tax returns during the pilot. The 2024 filing season serves as a pilot for Direct File, and the purpose is

to learn about the Direct File service itself and the needs of taxpayers who use it. By starting with a pilot, the IRS can efficiently learn about Direct File's effectiveness, identify areas of improvement for future iterations and ensure it meets the needs of taxpayers who want to use it.

Eligibility to participate in the 2024 pilot will be limited to reporting only certain types of income and claiming limited credits and adjustments. The tax scope for the pilot is still being finalized and is subject to change, but the IRS currently anticipates it will include:

Income reporting

W-2 wage income

Social Security and railroad retirement income

Unemployment compensation

Interest of \$1,500 or less

Credits

Earned Income Tax Credit

Child Tax Credit

Credit for Other Dependents

Deductions

Standard deduction

Student loan interest

Educator expense

The IRS will publicly share the results of the pilot when available.

Social Security Increase for 2024

The 3.2% Social Security increase for 2024 is higher than it has averaged over the past two decades, but it certainly is nowhere near the 8.7% increase we received for 2023.

This 2024 increase will mean \$58 more per month for those receiving the average benefit in 2023. Out of that \$58, we'll pay an additional \$10 for Medicare Part B.

How do they get these increase numbers every year? They get these numbers by comparing this year's third quarter to that of the previous year and do a cost of living adjustment (COLA) based on that. They also use the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) to calculate what they call a "basket of goods and services."

Therein lies our problem. While that index is no doubt useful for those who have to set financial policy for the country, the CPI-W index they use to calculate our Social Security benefit isn't geared to seniors. Instead, that index is geared toward blue collar (hourly) wage earners for 200 items and is broken down into eight groups: medical care, housing, food and beverage, transportation, housing, apparel, education and communication, and other goods and services.

You can see immediately why that doesn't work for seniors. We have vastly different medical costs, approximately double. Our housing costs are not the same. Transportation isn't the same, and neither are apparel, education or any of the others.

Another price index, however, the Consumer Price Index for Americans 62 years of age and older (R-CPI-E), considers the differences between the two groups ... but they still don't use the "E" index to calculate our Social Security.

Why is that, we wonder? I bet our representatives and senators in Congress would know the answer if we call them.(c) 2021 King Features Synd., Inc.
