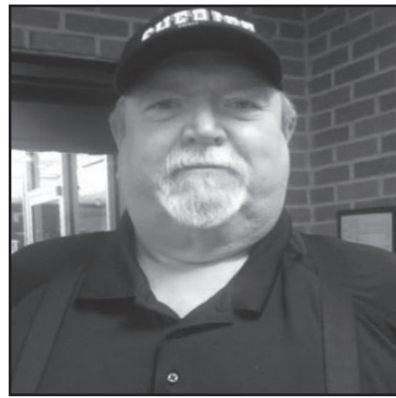
Her family thanks everyone for their unceasing prayers; as well as Life Care Center of Morgan County, Quality Hospice, and Schubert Funeral Home.

A Rocky Road South

I can't tell you how many times I have flown to Central Florida, but I can tell you the last time was a Monday, September 16, 2024. It turned out to be a pretty rocky flight.

The first problem was that the name on my ticket didn't match the one on my driver's license. The reason is when I had my driver's license changed from Florida to Tennessee, they had to see my birth certificate which list my name as Luther

Thomas Redmon and not Thomas Luther Redmon which my parents said was right. I have always gone by Thomas Redmon. My son-in-law called for my ticket while I was still in Tennessee and he gave my name as Thomas.

This has never been a problem, not even in the Maryville-Alcoa Airport because I have flown out of that airport at least three or four times after this driver's license change.

I had to sit there in a wheel chair for at least 45 minutes while they changed the name on my ticket to what was on my driver's license. I showed them my Humana Health card that read Thomas L. Redmon, I also showed them several other cards that read Thomas L. Redmon, but that wasn't enough to please them. I was not feeling well because of a lingering sickness that I still had. I had to make myself go to the

Redmon Reunion at Liberty Church on September 14 th and to the Liberty Church homecoming the next day. They were both great and I'm glad I got to go to both of them.

Well finally security got that done and then another problem arose. They checked the palm of my hands and found signs of gun powder. Robin and I figured it was from picking up my 4-10 shotgun that morning and emptying the shell that was in the chamber. I had put a shell in the gun several nights before. My hands were close to the gun barrel so I guess that is where the evidence of gun powder came from.

They told me that because of this I would have to go through a complete pat down. Boy was I lucky! This took another 30 minutes and I was about to experience nausea.

Finally, they told me I was free to go but my trip was ruined. I am close to 89 years of age so this was not at all pleasant, but I suppose they were just doing their job. They did explain to me why they were required to do certain things, but why didn't they have to do it the other three or four other times I had flown.

Still the trip to Tennessee was worth it all. I saw Redmon's I hadn't seen in a long time and I met many Redmon's I had never met. I just wish I had been a little younger or at least free from neuropathy.

Now I am trying to get settled in my winter home which is in Bradenton, Florida at my daughter's house.

BOI Deadline Approaching

Millions of businesses will be required to file the new Beneficial Ownership Information (BOI) report. The deadline is January 1, 2025, and the penalties for failing to file the report are severe. Civil penalties start at \$500 per day and criminal penalties of up to \$10,000 and/or two years in prison.

Companies created or registered in 2024 have 90 days to file the return. Any company created or registered after January 1, 2025, has only 30 days to file the return.

The purpose of the BOI report is to prevent fraudulent and illegal activities.

A business generally needs to file the report if it is a corporation, limited liability company, or a foreign company registered to do business in any U.S. state or Tribal jurisdiction by such a filing.

A Beneficial Owner is anyone who directly or indirectly exercises substantial control over or owns or controls at least 25 percent interest in a business.

An individual exercises substantial control over a reporting company if they fall into any of the following categories:

1. The individual is a senior officer;
2. The individual has authority to appoint or remove certain officers or a majority of directors;
3. The individual is an important decision-maker; or
4. The individual has any other form of substantial control.

The Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN) has provided additional details about each of the four reporting categories.

There are 23 types of entities that are exempt from filing the BOI report. The exempt entities include:

- Accounting firms
- Banks
- Brokers / securities dealers
- Insurance companies
- Investment companies / advisors
- Venture capital fund advisors

FinCEN's Small Entity Compliance Guide provides a list of reporting company exemptions and checklists to help determine if they are exempt from filing the BOI report.

FinCEN has created the BOI E-Filing system to electronically file the report.

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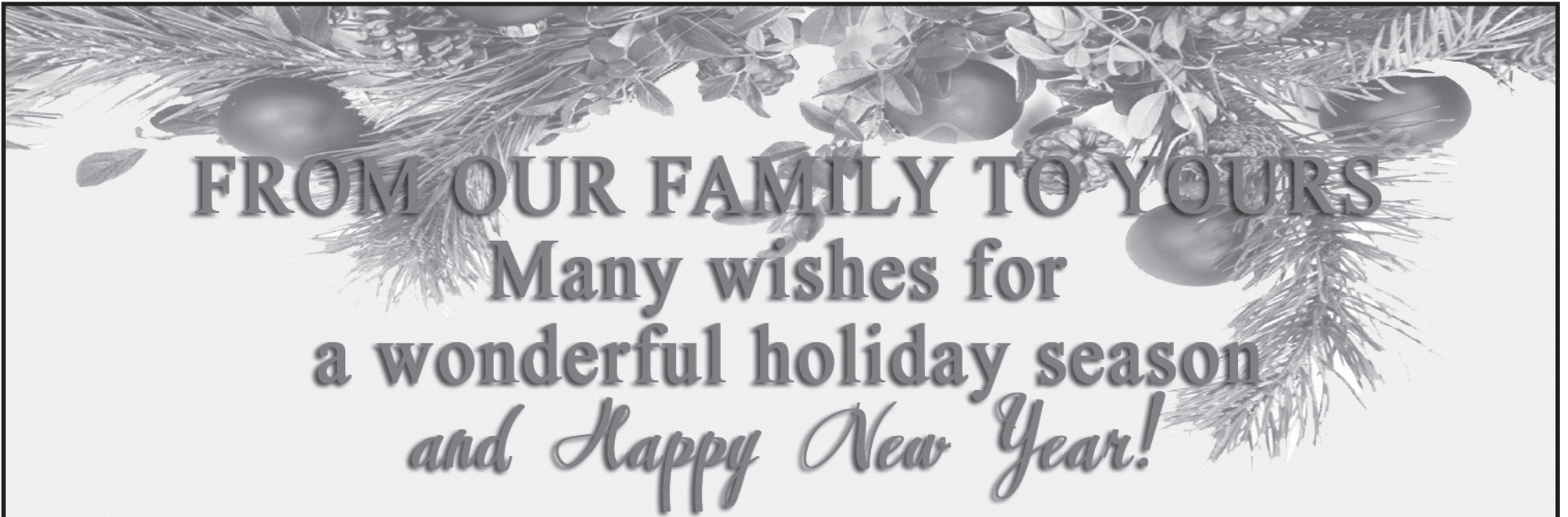

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Historically Speaking

New exhibit celebrates

Weinberg's life and works

On Oct. 27 an exhibit opened to the public on the life and accomplishments of Alvin Weinberg, director of Oak Ridge National Laboratory from 1955 to 1973, long-time Oak Ridge resident, author of nine books and 540 papers and co-inventor of the pressurized water reactor. PWRs propel the U.S. Navy's submarines and aircraft carriers and produce two-thirds of the world's carbon-free nuclear electricity. The exhibit is housed at the Children's Museum of Oak Ridge. Carolyn Krause presents a summary of the talks given following the ribbon cutting for the Weinberg Corner exhibit.

Beth Shea, executive director of the Children's Museum of Oak Ridge, opened the ceremony following the ribbon cutting at the exhibit. She said that when she learned about Alvin Weinberg, an internationally known scientist and national laboratory administrator who resided most of his life in Oak Ridge, and the collection of his papers at the museum, her response was "what a fabulous thing for a children's museum to have.

"I learned more about the collection, took a look, met with some people, and determined that it needed to be professionally archived, that it needed to be digitized, and then we needed to tell the story of Alvin Weinberg and his work."

Over a seven-year period, Weinberg's papers have been archived and digitized. And his story has been told through an online "Tribute to Alvin Weinberg" broadcast in 2021 over Zoom throughout the nation and is now being told through the new Weinberg Corner exhibit that opened to the public Oct. 27 in the museum's Discovery Lab.

In 2017, Shea said, Rhonda (Ronnie) Bogard – daughter of the museum's founding director, the late Selma Shapiro – "began leading an amazing team" that accomplished all the goals. "She's done all this with a smile," Shea noted.

As a scientist, science educator and the museum's director, Shea said she is planning to incorporate the Weinberg display into a larger STEM (science, technology, engineering, mathematics) exhibit. She added that she feels like she has been doing to Ronnie what her daughter, a cadet at the Air Force Academy, did to her when the two went hiking together in Colorado. Her daughter told her that the two were taking a 10-mile hike and then at the end revealed that they had hiked 15 miles. "She changed the goalposts but didn't tell me."

"When I started this project seven years ago," Bogard said, "what gave me my passion was that I knew it was so important to my mother." She added that the museum had "taken me in after she had passed away, brought me onto the board and really helped me with my grieving."

As she reviewed Weinberg's papers after digitizing them and prior to uploading them to the database, she said she was amazed about what she read.

"As a writer myself," she said, "I couldn't believe what he writes about, the way he interacts with people in his letters, his passion for humanity. He is the most transformative, most important consequential person that ever lived in Oak Ridge and has been part of our community. His writings show how he has impacted Oak Ridge, our country, and nations outside of the United States."

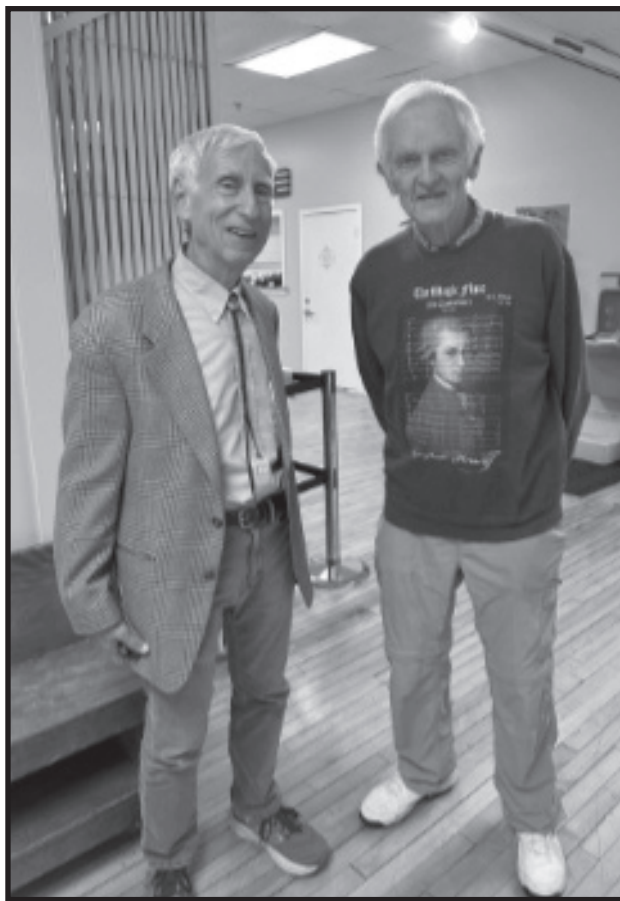
Bogard said that what was once a short-term project for her has become a lifelong project "because I'm completely devoted to getting the information about Weinberg out there, which is why we wanted to have this exhibit. Some visitors will just look at the information about Weinberg on the wall.

"Some people will look at the amazing videos and information in newspaper articles that are in the digital kiosk. I hope the exhibit will lead people really interested in Weinberg to the archive database, where they will likely have the same transformative experience as I had."

Also present at the Weinberg Corner ribbon cutting was Alvin Weinberg's son Richard, who lives in Durham, N.C., where he had worked at the Univer-

sity of North Carolina before retiring recently from his work in neuroscience. He told two stories about his famous father.

"Many of you know that Alvin was an excellent tennis player," he said. "In his later life he continued to play tennis at a high level and would get better compared to other people his age. I believe he won a

state championship in his 60s" in a competition with men his age.

Richard Weinberg noted that Alvin learned as a teenager that he had a heart murmur, and his doctor advised him to rest. Alvin, who had loved sports as a kid, gave up all athletic activities for two decades. Alvin's fear of exercise, Richard added, "was probably aggravated when his father died young of a heart attack."

Then in the 1950s, cardiologists advocated exercise even for people with "a questionable heart; Alvin, who took experts very seriously, started exercising and soon became fanatic about his tennis."

Richard said that, unlike his late brother David, he refused to take up tennis even though their father "thought it was the greatest thing in the world." But later in life Richard took up running for exercise.

Richard noted that his father "was a firm believer in progress, an idea that permeated American society in his era." Alvin was born in 1915 and survived diphtheria at age 5 (a disease that has since vanished due to the introduction of an effective vaccine). "In 1915," Richard noted, "out of every 1,000 American children born, 200 would be dead by the time they were 5. Today, out of 1,000 children, only 5 will die by the time they're 5."

Richard said that Alvin was "scarred by the Depression," which started in 1929. "You could see it by his interest in using coupons and taking advantage of Shoney's all-you-can-eat buffet."

Another sign of progress that Alvin witnessed was a gradual decline of antisemitism in America during his lifetimes. Alvin's cousin Leon Sternfeld, who was an excellent chemistry student and became an eminent physician, had tried to persuade his professor to write a letter of recommendation to help him get accepted in a graduate school chemistry program.

Leon told Richard that the professor said, "No, you're a great student, but you can't go to a chemistry graduate program because you're a Jew, and they won't hire you as a chemist."

Alvin explained to Richard that as a kid he spent summers with an uncle in Michigan early last century who explained that there were towns where it was unsafe for Jews to show up after dark.

"Things have changed so much," Richard said. "Alvin's view of progress was accurate."

A reactor concept that could represent progress in the generation of future carbon-free nuclear electricity is the molten salt reactor pioneered at ORNL and championed by Weinberg. The last speaker in the ceremony following the exhibit ribbon-cutting

was Syd Ball, one of the few living researchers who worked on the design, operation and analysis of the Molten Salt Reactor Experiment (MSRE) at ORNL. This groundbreaking, low-pressure, high-temperature reactor experiment was the first nuclear reactor of its kind to operate as this part of the thorium fuel cycle, which was to create nuclear fuel. But the reactor project that the federal government prioritized for large amounts of funding was not the molten salt breeder reactor but the liquid metal fast breeder reactor, which later was canceled.

Ball said that he has been invited to France more than once to tell people there studying molten salt reactor technology about Weinberg and the MSRE and the history of the technology. He told his French audiences that 11 ORNL divisions were involved in making the new reactor technology work. "They were very impressed by the way that Alvin could put together a team from the laboratory" to develop and test a reactor concept still of interest today, Ball said.

He mentioned that one of Weinberg's goals was to prove that the thorium fuel cycle would work. Thorium is found all over the world as a waste product. When thorium-232 is bombarded with neutrons in a reactor, it eventually turns into uranium-233, a fissionable fuel not found in nature. ORNL proved in 1968 that the MSRE can operate on U-233 fuel. Weinberg said that U-233 would not make an effective bomb material for terrorists to steal "because it explodes too soon."

Ball talked about the 2017 French documentary "Thorium: The Far Side of Nuclear Power," directed by Myriam Tonelotto of France. The film is dedicated in memoriam to Alvin Weinberg (1915-2006), and Weinberg appears in the film as a French-speaking animated character. Ball and Rick Weinberg are also interviewed in the film.

"Myriam said she had read just about every book Weinberg wrote," Ball said. "She isn't a physicist, but she is really good at promoting the thorium fuel cycle."

He added that in his career of more than 60 years at ORNL, working at the MSRE "was the most fun work I ever did," Ball said.

He made a case for building more nuclear reactors for producing clean energy and turning seawater into clean drinking water and for replacing fossil fuel plants that emit pollution that kills millions of people each year as well as greenhouse gases that accelerate climate warming. Like Weinberg, Ball sees nuclear power as a key to human progress.

Thanks, Carolyn, for a most thorough review of a very impressive set of remarks at the ribbon cutting of the Alvin Weinberg exhibit at the Children's Museum of Oak Ridge. It is a welcome addition to the many unique exhibits in museums at Oak Ridge.

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Pergamum in Jeremiah, Jeremiah 10 Vs. 1-4

Hear ye the word which the Lord speaketh, to you oh house of Israel: Thus sayeth the lord, learn not the way of the heathen, and be not dismayed at the signs of heaven: for the heathen are dismayed at them.

For the customs of the people are vain: for one cutteth a tree out of the forest, the work of the hands of the workman with the axe. They deck it with silver and gold: they fasten it with nails and with hammers that it move not.

Luke Chapter 10

(Luke 10:1-20) The mission of the seventy: The “clock” of the Lord’s “hour” was ticking (Jn. 2:4; Mt. 26:45): there was so much left to do, and so little time to get it done. Thus, Jesus appointed seventy (or maybe seventy-two) disciples to go out in pairs into cities he wanted to visit; their work was preparatory. The spiritual need was intense because there was a great harvest to be reaped, but the workers were few. There would be great danger along the way---like (defenseless) lambs among vicious wolves (v. 3).

As has been the case with the twelve (9:3), they were not to be burdened with provisions nor tarry for idle visits (v. 4). They were to be supported by those they taught, for the laborer is worthy of his wages (v. 7; 1 Tim. 5:18 and Paul’s use of “scripture”). When they entered a home they were to greet the occupants with “Peace.” This was a “code” term for a message of “peace with God” (Rom. 5:1), and a recipient of the message was a “son of peace” (v. 6). The admonition to not be aloof regarding foods offered (v. 8) suggests either some association with Gentiles or with Jews lax in their food choices.

Their mission was to be authenticated by the performance of miracles, which included healing the sick and casting out demons (v. 17). The message documented was this: “the kingdom of God is very near” (it was but some six months away), coming into fruition on Pentecost (Acts 2). The seventy were to proclaim the same message of judgment that the Lord did (v. 12-15; Matt. 11:20-24). In what manner one responds to a messenger of Christ, to listen or to reject, he treats the Lord in like fashion. Let those who exult in their red-letter edition of the Bible take note.

When their mission was accomplished, the seventy reconnected with Christ, rejoicing that they had cast out demons by his authority. The Lord symbolically suggested that such was a prelude of the fall of Satan, like lightning from heaven, swiftly and dramatically at the appropriate time. The statement has no reference to the original fall of Satan from heaven, though that was a reality which may be argued logically from several biblical texts. These disciples had been provided with divine protection on their mission. Their work, miraculous though it was, was not to be compared with the great joy to come---heaven, where they were “enrolled” already (Heb. 12:23).

(Luke 10:21-24) The joy of Christ (Mt. 11:25-30): In that same hour, Jesus “rejoiced in the Holy Spirit.” This is the solitary New Testament text that speaks of the Savior rejoicing, which is not intended to suggest that he was not joyful on other occasions. He breathes a short prayer which includes: (a) thanksgiving; (b) acknowledgement of God as his Father; (C) profession of God’s sovereignty over heaven and earth; (d) gratitude that the Father allows the truth to be hidden from those wise in their own conceit, and yet honors those with a babe-like thirst for learning. Christ acknowledges his subordination to the Father as a result of the incarnation and expressed appreciation for the unique Father-Son relationship (v. 22). Those to whom the Son wills to reveal these things are those who are honest and will make the appropriate use of them. To the disciples privately, the Lord called attention to the fact that they were experiencing wonderful things to which prophets and kings were never privy. How blessed they were in this capacity (v. 24).

(Luke 10:25-37) The parable of the good Samaritan: Earlier, the Samaritans had been thrust into a negative light (9:51-56). Christ will now show a different side to some of these people, thus preparing for the eventual acceptance of the Samaritans into his kingdom. A lawyer (scribe [5:17, 21]) sought to test Jesus, asking: “What shall I do to inherit eternal life?” The verb suggests an act that, once completed, exhausts one’s spiritual responsibility. The Lord turned it back on the man: “You are the lawyer; what is written in the law, and how do you interpret it?” The man responded correctly---love God with all your heart, soul, and strength (totally), and your neighbor as yourself (summing up all religious and moral duty). The lawyer subsequently revealed his lack of appreciation for the connection between theory and practice. Jesus plainly responded: “This do and you will live.” Christ changed the tense of the verb to emphasize sustained obedience. In an attempt to shift the attention from himself, the lawyer inquired: “Who is my neighbor?” Sometimes it is better not to ask if you don’t know what the

response might be!

The Lord began this famous parable. A Jew was traveling the road called “the bloody way” from Jerusalem down to Jericho, a distance of seventeen miles down a steep descent known for its danger. He fell into the grasp of violent robbers who stripped him and beat him, leaving him a bloody mess by the roadside (v.30). Presently, both a Hebrew priest and then a Levite (religious officials) passed by, ignoring their Jewish brother, leaving him to die for all they knew.

Eventually, a Samaritan came along---a dreaded dirty-dog enemy. He might be expected to ignore the man at best or finish him off at worst. Amazingly, however, the compassionate soul medicated the victim’s wounds, bandaged them, put him on his own donkey, took him to an inn, and cared for him overnight (v. 34). As he departed the next day, he paid the innkeeper in advance for about three weeks of care, promising to look in on the unfortunate soul later on and even pay more if necessary!

Then came Jesus’ devastating follow-up question: which of the three---priest, Levite, or Samaritan---proved to be the neighbor? The lawyer could not choke out the term, “Samaritan.” He simply used that distant, “He who showed mercy.” Christ added, if one may be permitted to paraphrase: “Go and do [consistently practice, as reflected by the verb] the same attitude and action.” The question, “Who is my neighbor?” has been answered: anyone who needs your help and to whom you are able to render assistance.

(Luke 10:38-42) The Martha---Mary controversy: This incident is not to be confused with another situation in which both Mary and Martha played a role (Jn. 12:1-8). While Jesus and his disciples were traveling, perhaps either to or from Jerusalem, “he” (apparently Jesus alone) took a detour into Bethany, which was the home of Lazarus, Martha, and Mary. No mention is made of Lazarus being there. Martha, perhaps the older sister, invited Jesus into their home. As soon as the Lord had seated himself, Mary ignoring common convention, went directly to his feet, anxious for every holy word that fell from his lips. This was unusual since, normally, rabbis did not tutor female students. In the meantime, Martha busied herself with much energy and agitation, likely preparing a good meal for her special guest (no doubt with the best of motives).

Finally, Martha, exasperated, approached Christ and made a strong complaint---which really was directed at both Mary and her Teacher! “Lord, don’t you even care that my sister has left me to do all the work?” She might as well have said, “If you would stop talking, maybe she would do something.” She insisted: “Tell her to take hold of this responsibility with me.” This is a very strong request that borders on a command! Jesus responded, by saying, “Martha, Martha”---the double use of the name is significant (22:31). It is an admonition. Those who have gone to such pains to completely exonerate Martha have not fully considered the following. “You are agitated and distracted about many things: but Mary has chosen the good portion, which will not be taken away from.” There would be plenty of opportunity for house work later; time with the Son of God would be precious forever. Mary had learned that “man does not live by bread alone.”
